Citizen's Police Academy

The Cincinnati Police Department's Citizens Police Academy officially began in October 1994.

The concept of a Citizens Police Academy started in England in 1977. The first such course in the

United States was at the Orlando, Florida Police Department in 1985. The program is designed to

provide better understanding between citizens and the police through education.

Another Citizens Police Academy is scheduled for March 20-May 8, eight consecutive Thursday nights at the Police Academy from 6-9pm. Topics include: Organizational Overview, Professional Standards, Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) Team, Terrorism Early Warning Group, Laws of Arrest, Criminal Investigation Process, Mental Response Team, Gangs, Domestic Violence, Drug Awareness, Traffic Contacts, Use of Force and Personal Safety. Participants will also have an opportunity to experience the role of a police officer through the use of a firearms simulator. The IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program is up and running for the 2014 tax season. The VITA Program generally offers free tax help to people who make \$52,000 or less and need assistance in preparing their own tax returns. IRScertified volunteers provide free basic income tax return preparation with electronic filing to qualified individuals in local communities. They can inform taxpayers about special tax credits for which they may qualify such as Earned Income Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, and Credit for the Elderly or the Disabled.
